Survival Program Spotlight: Delivery Care

The health of mothers and newborns is intricately related. Because of this, Compassion church partners provide prenatal care to give expectant moms and their babies the support they need for a safe and healthy birth. Mothers are able to attend prenatal medical appointments, when in the past they could never have considered such an expense. They also receive transportation to their local health center or hospital so they can keep those appointments. If their pregnancy has proceeded smoothly, skilled birth attendants guide and support them through the birthing process. Mothers who develop complications are connected to advanced medical care (including surgery, if necessary). After the babies arrive, the program gifts the new moms with baskets full of hygiene supplies and newborn necessities. All of this is possible through your generous giving!

Renewing Hope for Florah

Dear Friends,

My name is Florah. My child is James. I thank God for this opportunity and for His grace. I was three months pregnant when I was registered. I am so much thankful for all the services that I have received.

I had complications while I was pregnant and needed two surgeries. There was no way that I could have afforded all these expenses. My baby would have died, or I would have died. My babe is one year old now. We mothers have learned a lot, including breastfeeding education and the importance of immunizations. We have learned how to make nutritious food for our children. We get treatment when we feel sick. We are provided meat, bananas and potatoes, which are essential for repairing the mother's body after delivery.

Survival provides many group activities. We make nutritious flour to sell. We grow vegetables to sell and to use in our daily meals. We sew rugs and decorations to sell. We make hand soap and sanitizers to prevent communicable diseases, and we sell it to our fellow neighbors to earn income. We are taught entrepreneurship seminars. These help us to establish our small businesses. We are learning how to keep our environment clean to avoid dangerous diseases.

The program has also helped us to grow spiritually. Some of us didn't know how to pray, but we now know and are doing so. We participate in church services, which is a great spiritual milestone to us. We have also improved socially. We have learned to cooperate and help each other when we face problems.

Thank you so much for your support. May God bless you and keep you and protect you from various circumstances in this world.

Survival parents learn about the importance of breastfeeding. The mothers committed to breastfeed exclusively for the first six months after birth, and the fathers committed to provide for the mothers' nutritional needs.



31 babies and their mothers served

3 babies born, and 100% had a healthy birth weight

6 pregnant mothers received prenatal care
